BYOB drinks and appetizers if you wish. Refreshments in the backyard at 7:00pm. Singing begins at 7:30pm.

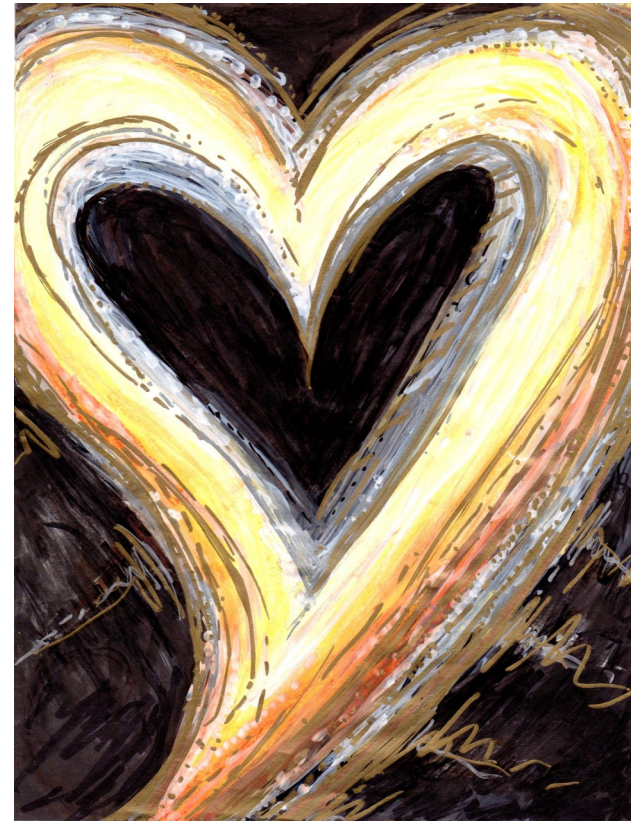
