UUFSD Climate Action Win-Win Fundraising Opportunity

As we head into summer, there will be days when the electrical power grid will have trouble keeping up with demand. During power use surges, fast acting (and dirty and expensive) power plants are brought online to meet demand. A company called OhmConnect.com serves as a virtual power station working with SDG&E and users to reduce use during these key times so there is enough electricity to go around, without (resorting to those polluting power plants).

If you sign up in the next few days (before the end of June), UUFSD will get a referral fee, \$40, and each participant will get \$10, so it's a win-win all the way around.
